

N.A.C.I. Award Descriptions

Instructions: Due Date is June 5th, at 12:30 p.m.

All grade 12 students who wish to be considered for scholarships or awards must submit a form. Criteria for selection will be based on scholarship, leadership, citizenship and sportsmanship. Be sure to indicate which scholarships you wish to apply for. Do not apply for scholarships that you are not eligible for. The Harris Scholarship and the Mrs. and Inspector Butcher Scholarship require essays.

Apprenticeship Scholarship

\$600.00

This award is provided by Neepawa Plumbing & Heating, John's Electric and JC Lavich Construction. Recipient must be entering into any apprenticeship vocation, either going directly into college or else the apprenticeship program. Consideration will be given to citizenship and work ethic, but will not be based on marks.

Bank of Montreal Scholarship

\$200.00

Bank of Montreal Scholarship

Recipient must be continuing education in the field of business or agriculture.

Beautiful Plains Farming for Tomorrow 4-H Scholarship

\$500.00

Recipient must have been involved in 4-H for at least 5 years, but does not have to be in the last year. This award will be awarded to a 4-H member entering post-secondary education. Selection is based on 4H and community involvement and scholastic ability.

Beautiful Plains Teachers Association - Teaching as a career

\$650.00

Recipient must be attending the faculty of education. This award is awarded on academic achievement, leadership and service.

Beautiful Plains Teachers Association Post Secondary Studies Scholarship

\$650.00

Recipient must be attending any post-secondary institution. This award is awarded on academic achievement, leadership and service.

Betty-Ann Bremner Memorial Scholarship

\$600.00

Recipient must have completed at least two geography credits at NACI (Grade 10 - 12) Recipient must be registered at Brandon University for at least 3 credit hours in geography.

Brad Mayor Memorial Hockey Scholarship

\$1000.00

Recipient must have played on the Tigers Hockey Team. Recipient must display leadership, consistency and determination while on the hockey team. Not necessarily based on academics. Recipient must be attending a university, college or accredited Trade program upon graduation from NACI.

Brookdale Community Award of Merit

\$300.00

Recipient must have graduated from Brookdale School and participated in school and community activities in Brookdale and beyond and plan on continuing education. Recipient must display good citizenship

Candy Brown Memorial Scholarship

\$600.00

Recipient must be registered in a nursing program or a career in a health field within 2 years of the completion of grade 12.

Carl McGregor Bursary Fund

\$800.00

Recipient must be continuing education in an agricultural or science related program at a community college level. Award is based on character, academic standing and being an area resident for at least 3 years.

Chown Centennial Scholarship

\$1,000.00

Recipient must have a minimum average of 85% on five grade 12 courses and be registered at the University of Manitoba. The student should be considered as one of the top academic graduates of N.A.C.I.

Ducks Unlimited Canada Neepawa Chapter Scholarship

\$500.00

Preference will be given to someone going into Conservation or Water Stewardship, or if not applicable Land Science or Environmental Science. Not based solely on marks, student must show interest in being involved in the community and volunteerism.

Eden Community Scholarship

This award consists of a cheque for \$139.00

Recipient must have attended J.M.Young School

Harris Family Scholarship

\$500.00 and a plaque

Those students who wish to be considered for this award must write a one page, single spaced article outlining the role athletics has had in their life, and what role they see athletics will have in their future.

The recipient must be actively involved in both school and community sport programs. Recipient must display leadership qualities in school and community. Recipient must be continuing education in a post-secondary program, continuing their involvement in athletics or seeking a career in an athletic field.

It's Time/ Tridekon Scholarship

\$1200.00

Recipient should be someone who shows an entrepreneurial spirit, innovation, passion, optimism and determination in setting and reaching goals for themselves. The recipient must have a great work ethic and strong sense of community and citizenship. This scholarship is not based on academic achievement but on character and spirit. The recipient may use the scholarship freely with the idea that it is used to help work towards their own goals. The recipient does NOT need to be enrolled in school in the fall.

Jeff McCannell Memorial Scholarship

\$360.00

Recipient must have a combined average of 70% or above in grades 11 and 12. Recipient must be furthering studies at a university or community college in the next year and facing the added burden of attending school outside the community. Recipient must be active in both community sports and school sports at some time during grades 9 - 12.

Joan and Ron Gray Scholarship for Caring and Service to Others

\$500.00

The award shall be given to a graduating NACI student who has demonstrated his/her passion for caring and service to others and who intends to pursue education or training in a caring profession.

The money shall be used by the recipient to pay his/her tuition or training costs or books or room and board. Preference in the selection of the recipient shall be given to a qualified student who has overcome adversity in his/her life and who may be in a position of financial need.

Keith Jordan Memorial Bursary Award

\$300.00

This bursary is named in memory of Keith Jordan, a long serving Referee-in Chief for Neepawa Minor Hockey. Keith displayed passion and commitment to the mentorship of young officials. This bursary is awarded to a graduating student attending NACI who displays similar characteristics to those of Keith's; with knowledge for the game, and good teamwork skills. The recipient should have the ability to work with other developing officials. The recipient is responsible, enthusiastic and competent with a dedication to officiating in the Neepawa Minor Hockey Association.

The graduating student must be in good academic standing and must have officiated in his/her grade 12 year.

Langford Centennial Scholarship

\$500.00 and Centennial history book

Recipient must be resident of Municipality of Langford and display excellent leadership and citizenship. Recipient must be continuing education

Lawrence Hurrell Memorial Scholarship

\$1000.00

Recipient must be continuing education in a trade related field at a community college or by apprenticeship. This award is not judged by marks alone and consideration is given to school or community contribution

M.E. Osborne Memorial Scholarship

\$500.00

Recipient must be continuing education including exchange or other similar program. Recipient must show good work ethics, one who works hard for the marks they were able to obtain.

Margaret Laurence Literary Scholarship

\$200.00

This award will be awarded to a student who has shown promise in creative writing. Recipient must be attending a post-secondary institution

Mental Health Scholarship

\$800.00

This scholarship is awarded to someone who is enrolled in or plans to pursue a career in either mental health or addictions. Recipient should show empathy and compassion to other students and a willingness to help their peers

Mrs. A.K. And Inspector J. Butcher Scholarship

\$1737.00

The recipient must have shown a sincere intention to further their education at university or college and have been strongly focused toward that end. He/She shall have achieved scholastically at a satisfactory level. Each candidate must submit a typed application letter answering the following questions. You must answer the questions in the same numbered order as they appear below. It may be at most two typed pages each printed on one side only. Relate your answers to the criteria listed. You may give longer answers for some of the questions and shorter answers for others as they might apply to you. But, you must answer all the questions. You may seek assistance from parents, staff, etc.

1. What are your career intentions for next year and ensuing years? What have you done to investigate this choice? What did you find out? Where will you study? Explain your steps so far.
2. Why do you feel this career path would be right for you? Why do you feel that you would be successful?
3. Who or what has influenced your decision?
4. How do you plan to finance this further education? Explain in some detail.
5. Besides school course work what have you done to prepare yourself to be successful in your choice of career?

NACI Safe Grad Scholarship

\$250.00 each

Recipient must be furthering studies at a university or college next year, facing the added burden of relocation in order to pursue studies. Both recipients and parents/guardians must have volunteered or participated in Safe Grad activities. Up to 2 recipients are chosen.

Neepawa Area Health Auxiliary Scholarship

\$1000.00

This award is offered to a graduating student who meets the following criteria:

The recipient must be going on to further training in a health related area, immediately following high school graduation. The scholarship will be awarded upon proof of documentation of acceptance to the second year of the medical program or upon completion of a certificate medical program.

Preference is given to students with Teen Volunteering experience and academic performance is also to be considered.

Olive Cupis Memorial Scholarship

\$1650.00

Recipient must be attending U of M in a humanities or social science program. Recipient must have an average of 75% on top four 40S credits.

Rosedale Centennial Scholarship

\$500.00

The recipient of this award must reside in the Municipality of Rosedale. It is based on academic performance. The Grad must be going on to further studies preferably at Community College level. Recipient must not receive any other monetary award.

Roy Lewis Memorial Scholarship

\$500.00

Recipient must have attended Arden School and be furthering their education.

Royal Canadian Legion Ladies Auxiliary Scholarship

\$1000.00

Recipient must be a descendent of a member of the Legion. Planning a future education and not receiving any other award

Town of Neepawa Scholarship

\$500.00

Recipient must be furthering his/her education in the Municipal Business and/or Business field. Scholarship will be awarded to a student with leadership qualities.

Viterra Scholarship

\$200.00

Recipient must be entering the agriculture degree or diploma program at college or university. Award is based on academic achievement. (Can take 1 year off.)

Vivian Motor Hotel Scholarship

\$1000.00

Recipient must be enrolled in Hotel & Restaurant Administration, Chef Training, Foods & Services, business or a related area at a Manitoba College level only. The award is based on sound character and academic standing.

Westman Award of Excellence Scholarship

\$500.00

The recipient must have shown a willingness to volunteer their time, excel in academics and want to stay in Manitoba while pursuing education and careers that involve technology. The youth should have impacted our community in a positive way.

Whitmore Family Scholarship

\$1426.00

Recipient must be registered for post-secondary education at a university or college in Manitoba. This scholarship will be awarded to a student with well-rounded attributes including good academic standing, leadership and sportsmanship, active participation and contribution to the school and/or community. Recipient must face the added financial burden of relocation to pursue academic studies.

Wilson Memorial Award

Recipient receives \$500.00, a plaque, and a plaque to recognise award winners is on display in the school

Recipient must have been actively involved in both school and community sport. Grad has displayed leadership qualities in both school and community programs. Volunteering is an asset. Recipient must be continuing their education in a post-secondary program.

Yellowhead Roadrunners Scholarship

\$500.00

Recipient must be enrolled in a post-secondary program - either Auto Mechanics, Auto body, Heavy Duty Mechanics, Small Engine Repair. Preference is given to anyone planning on returning to the community upon graduation

Adventures in Technology Award

Attendance at the event and a plaque from the Neepawa Rotary Club.

This is a Rotary-sponsored trip to Regina. One student was chosen to attend a 4-day workshop hosted by the Rotary Clubs of Regina and sponsored by the Neepawa Rotary Club. The recipient attended tours of industries in Regina, research and development centers and Agribition.

Governor General's Bronze Medal

This medal is awarded to the graduating student with the highest average in Grade 11 and 12 courses. The average includes all grade 11 and 12 courses as listed on the student's official Transcript of Grades.

Grade 12 Individual Band Awards

Each winner receives a group photo and an individual picture. These are provided by the Band Booster Club.

This award is given to the graduating members of the Lions or Jazz Bands in recognition of their extracurricular commitment. The Band Booster Club provides these awards.

Pins

Pins are awarded to students attending N.A.C.I. who attain an academic average of 80 to 89%.

HyLife Foods Academic Excellence Award

\$1000.00

This award is awarded to the student with the highest average in Grade 11 and 12. Student must be furthering his/her education.

International Rotary Youth Exchange

John Philip Sousa Band Award

A large engraved plaque which remains in the school plus a small engraved plaque for the student to keep.

This award is given each year to a graduating member of members of the Lions Band Graduating class in recognition of outstanding achievement and interest in instrumental music.

Kin Club Academic Proficiency Award - Special Education Medal

An engraved medal from the Kin Club

This award is offered to a student in the Life Skills Class for outstanding progress throughout the year.

N.A.C.I. Staff Award of Merit

\$250.00

This award is presented to students who contribute to the quality of life at NACI by portraying good citizenship as well as maintaining a sound academic proficiency.

Neepawa Elks Scholarship

\$1000.00

Awarded to a runner up to a top, all-round student based upon academic performance, character, school involvement, citizenship and qualities of leadership. Recipient must be furthering their education within 2 years.

Neepawa Kin Club Scholarship

\$1000.00

Awarded to a runner up to the top, all-round student based upon academic performance, character, school involvement, citizenship and qualities of leadership. Recipient must be furthering their education within 2 years.

Neepawa Lions Club Scholarship

\$2000.00

Awarded to the top, all-round student based upon academic performance, character, school involvement, citizenship and qualities of leadership. Recipient must further his/her education within 2 years.

Neepawa Rotary Club Scholarship

\$2000.00

Awarded to a runner up to the top, all-round student based upon academic performance, character, school involvement, citizenship and qualities of leadership. Recipient must be furthering their education within 1 year.

Principal's Honor Roll

Pins

Pins are awarded to students attending N.A.C.I. who attain an academic average of 90% or better.

R.C.M.P. Athletic Award

A large trophy that remains in the school plus a plaque for the student to keep.

This award is given to the top male and female athletes at N.A.C.I.

Teen Volunteering Awards

Participants with 25 - 49 hours receive a certificate. Participants with 50 hours or more receive a certificate and a pin.

Every year a number of students participate in the "Teen Volunteer" program. These students volunteer their time at Country Meadows or the Neepawa Hospital during the school year.

This award is given annually to the male or female who was outstanding in sportsmanship, leadership, and athletic ability throughout the year.
